Although the Ohio River is 12 miles away, the town's nautical name was derived from the retirement home of riverboat captain James W. Goslee when it was incorporated in 1878. Tradition has it that the anchor that hangs inside the rim of a locomotive wheel in the center of town is the one that Captain Goslee removed from his ship, the Matamora, and put on his lawn in 1869.

Today, Anchorage's citizens, municipal officials, school board, and more both enjoy the city and uphold the mantle of responsibility to preserve its character and strengthen its standing for the future.
