

Our Community

Northshore School District, located just northeast of Seattle, spans 60 square miles across two counties. Nestled between mountains, lakes, and forests, it offers both natural beauty and easy access to a vibrant metropolitan area with arts, sports, and a thriving culture. The district benefits from a strong local economy and a supportive community, with over 11,000 active school volunteers, a dedicated <u>schools foundation</u>, and a robust community <u>scholarship program</u>.









How to Apply

The base salary will be in the range of \$350,000 - \$380,000, plus a comprehensive benefits package. The final base salary and benefits package will be negotiated and based upon proven experience, qualifications, and meeting Board criteria.

Requirements

Northshore encourages all qualified candidates to apply. Superintendent credentials are required. Washington's superintendent accreditation process is available at the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction <u>website</u>. The Northshore School Board prefers a candidate with superintendency experience or executive level experience at a mid-size to large district. An advanced degree and multilingual skills are also preferred.

Application Process

Individuals wishing to be considered for the Northshore Superintendent position should submit an <u>online</u> <u>application</u> by April 20, 2025, which includes:

• A letter of application, the online application form, a current resume, and 3-4 current letters of recommendation.

All application materials will remain confidential to the fullest extent allowed by law. After all applications have been reviewed and preliminary interviews conducted by the consulting firm, the top candidates will be presented to the Northshore School Board for consideration. Selection of candidates for interviews is the sole responsibility of the Board.
